

Message from the President:

What an exciting time of year; the beginning of the new season! Let me be the first to welcome you all to the 2010-2011 season of the IWPA, our 27th season on record.

During the board meeting there were only a few rules that were changed. Renewing Judges; you should have already received your renewal forms. Be sure to review it and return to George Ferrari as he is the current Judges Chair once again. There seems to be some confusion in regard to the age limit allowed for dogs to compete. That rule was not changed we merely attempted to clarify the rule however, the meaning is still the same. Basically if a dog turns 12 *during* the season it is allowed to finish that season. If it is already 12 (meaning its birthday was before September 1st of that calendar year) it can NOT pull.

Another change we should be sure to bring to everyone's attention is the date in which you may take advantage of the \$5.00 discount for EARLY membership renewal. That date is changed from October 1st to SEPTEMBER 1ST, one month earlier. I know Rodney Martin your current Membership Chairperson has already sent out current membership forms for your renewals; you should have already received it in the mail. If you want to take advantage of the early discount make sure your membership is postmarked by the U.S. Post Office on or before September 1st. I also want to encourage everyone, if possible, to accept the Pulling Power Newsletter in PDF which will also allow for a \$5.00 discount. Using both discounts you can save \$10.00 off the cost of your membership. That is a savings of 25% off an individual membership. Last year nearly 2/3^{rds} of our membership accepted their Newsletter in PDF. Thank you so much!!! Not only do you get your Newsletter faster than through snail mail, you also get it in color!

Speaking of our "Pulling Power" Newsletter, this will be the only newsletter you will receive without a renewed membership. We send it out as a courtesy because we want to insure everyone has the opportunity to review the minutes of our board meeting and any new changes that have been made. (Subliminal message.....Be sure to have your membership renewal postmarked on or before September 1st to take advantage of the \$5.00 additional discount!)

I want to also encourage you all to send in photographs to the Newsletter Committee that are taken during dog pulls this season. At times we need filler items which are where we can use your photographs. Please keep in mind we may or may not use one or more of them depending on space. The photograph/s may be used at any time during the season not necessarily immediately preceding your submission.

Conference call for the special board meeting regarding an investigation cost almost \$700.00. The club received \$374.85 in discounts this year off the price to print the newsletters. \$40.00 in returned check fees.

Championship Chair: Terry Reed, report attached

2010 Championships were held on April 24, 25 in Enfield, CT. 43 entries on snow, 50 entries on wheels, records were broken in 4 weight classes on artificial snow. Next season is scheduled to be in the central districts, regions 3,4,6,8, or 9.

Drug Testing: Robbie Reed, report attached

Testing was done at the championships by a local technician; testing was completed in 1st through 5th places. A total of 48 samples were submitted for testing; all tests were negative. Cost was \$55.00 per sample.

Membership: Rodney Martin, report attached

Report attached, down 11 from last year, 28 single, 17 new family members, 44 renewing singles, 51 renewing families, and 4 lifetime members for a total of 144 members.

Sanctioning: Sue Ferrari, report attached.

103 pulls sanctioned, 5 of the 103 were fun pulls. Organizers for the Hawaii fun event have not paid, they are now members not in good standing. No major issues.

Judges Chair: George Ferrari, report attached

41 judges certified for the 2009-2010 season; 5 of which were new. One judge has been placed on probation for the coming season. One renewal was received at the end of the season that was returned since the individual was not a judge the previous year; to be completed via proper channels for new judges. DQ's were called for the following reasons: un-sportsman like conduct; baiting, on or over the line, one slingshot, 3

tangles, 16 called dog before crossing the line, or touching their dogs too soon.

Ballots were in attendance for auditing. There were 2 issues this year; one, a judge was left off the ballot for chief judges, and 2 members did not receive their ballots. Ballots from members missing would not have changed the outcome.

Motion revised: Section 2, a 2, "All dogs must be at least one year of age. Dogs may not be more than 12 years of age at the beginning of the season to compete in any IWPA event." **MSC**

Rule Booklet Whips Sections 5, c,14

Q: pinch collars used, is the event the day, while you are pulling, weekend etc.

An IWPA event is the whole IWPA event; the entire time of each day not just when a person is pulling in their class. The event is considered to be from the time the first person arrives to the time the last person leave. The

event is also the area that the IWPA insurance covers which covers the other areas on the property, parking lot, stands, etc.

Motion: "Rule Booklet, Section 5, C, 14 add "The use of" **MSC**

Standing Rules, Article 5, section 1 discussed this article.

Standing Rules, Article 3, section 8, a, discussed this article. Should region 6 be moved for the championship rotation, or rotation changed? A committee will be assigned to obtain information and facts. George will head the committee along with Stephanie Pitz, Rodney Martin and David Gallagher.

Discussed emails from the membership:

- Discussion on the Chief Judge at the Championship.
- Discussed equipment, the board appointing/paying a vendor/s to supply equipment for use in champion-ships. Board's option is that all dogs competing are competing with the same advantage and disadvantage.
- Feature a dog in each newsletter, currently we have a hard time getting photo's much less information on the dogs. If membership would send the information in to us we could do that. The board will not change the cover but could do an article inside the newsletter
- Volunteer list to Identify talents that would be beneficial to the club; this would be more of the region reps job. Or could this to used to get the IWPA membership more involved? The board could send out the question to the membership in the newsletter. This would be an excellent job for a member to complete for the rest of the memberships.
- Discussed keeping a listing of addresses of person who have inquired about the club. This would be best kept by the organizers or the regions.
- Discussed holding a conference call instead of the board meeting yearly. The Constitution and By-Laws prohibited. A conference call is very expense. The board conference call that was held this season was over \$700.00 for 2 hours.
- Discussed maintaining information on dogs and history of their pulls.
- Facebook, who would maintain, would this just be another message board? Each region may want to do this for their area.
- Discussed information that was obtained about a dog's weight not being recorded correctly; if this
- information is correct it may have changed the point standings. This will be monitored during the
- organizer's probation status over the next season since the board cannot change last season.
- Reward the dogs and owners that have been with the club several years and that are Champions; create a regional and national hall of fame. Have a regional hall of fame and a national hall of fame. Step one, you would have to be voted into your regional hall of fame; 5 separate years of winning regional medals, 2 years of winning a national medal to qualify for the National hall of fame. This could build interest in the club. The board would like to see a committee complete a proposal for this and bring the information to the next board meeting for the board to vote on. David will complete this and get a committee together and work on this.
- Discussed the IWPA should accept electronic forms and payments. Forms currently can be sent
- electronically. Robbie will contact Shawn to obtain the information on electronic payments.
- Alcohol consumption at a pull; this is covered under handler conduct in the rule booklet.
- Pulling surface, leveling. This has been addressed for years; all handlers are at the same advantage or
- disadvantage as all the other competing on that surface.
- Protest process and the duties of the chief judge; this is handled by the chief judge at a pull or a grievance can be filed, then the grievance committee will handle.
- Discussed the point system.

I.D. Your Pet

It's crucial for your pet to have identification so he can be returned if he gets lost.

Here are three popular methods:

- Collar tags. The most common and visible form of I.D., a tag simply attaches to your dog's collar to display the dog's name and your phone number. But your pet must wear his
- collar at all times, and it's always possible that it or the tag could detach.
- Tattoos. More permanently than a tag, a tattooed pet I.D. number links your dog to a national organization, like the AKC's Companion Animal Recovery Program.
- Microchips. Another permanent form of I.D. is a microchip. The size of a grain of rice, it's implanted under the dog's skin (no anesthesia or surgery is required). It contains an alpha numeric code that can be read by animal shelters equipped with a hand scanner. The shelter then notifies the chip manufacturer that the pet has been found, and the manufacturer contacts the owner.

Because a tattoo or microchip could go undetected, supplement them with a collar and tag.

INTERNATIONAL WEIGHT PULL ASSOCIATION WEIGHT PULL STANDING RULES ON SANCTIONING

In order for your pull to be sanctioned and to count for points.

Any organization who wishes to put on a pull approved by the I.W.P.A. shall require the organizer or any of the officials to have an I.W.P.A. membership and use I.W.P.A. weight pull rules which include having an I.W.P.A. certified and approved judge.

A sanctioning application must be filled out by the organizer and delivered into the hands of the I.W.P.A. sanctioning director no later than the 15th of the month preceding the month in which the event is to take place, provided the event is scheduled between the 15th through the end of any given month. Pulls scheduled from the 1st through the 14th of any month must be received no later than the 15th of the month two months prior to the weight pull event. For example, an event scheduled for December 7th must be received no later than October 15th, an event scheduled for December 28th must be received no later than November 15th. *No exceptions to this rule will be made!!* It is the organizer's responsibility to ascertain if this application has been received by the Sanctioning Director.

Newsletter pull calendar information is taken from the sanctioning application; therefore, ALL questions must be answered. It may be considered false advertising for any organizer to falsify or fail to follow the information provided on the sanctioning request. False advertising will be grounds for placing the organizer on probationary sanctioning status.

The following list of information from your weight pull must be sent to the <u>Sanctioning Director</u> with a postmark no later than 5 days after the last day of your pull:

- 1. Weight Pull finish report
- 2. Organizer's report
- 3. Financial report with ALL monies due the IWPA for the \$5.00 per dog fee. For pulls held in Canada \$5.00 are payable in U.S. funds only. (Motion6/07)
- 4. All regular and provisional membership monies received at your pull with completed membership forms must be sent to the <u>Membership Director</u> with a postmark no later than **5 days** after the last day of your pull. New members are to be given the membership receipt included in your packet as proof of membership until their card is sent to them.
- 5. Send <u>Judge's Reports</u> to the <u>Judge Chairperson</u>

(The penalty for failure to meet the 5 day postmark requirement will result in a fine of not less than \$20.00 and \$5.00 per day for each day after 6 days that the pull results are not postmarked. Failure to pay a fine may result in loss of sanctioning and/or points). *Exception—Organizers of pulls held the last two weeks of the season are required to submit finish reports to the sanctioning director and FAX or OVERNIGHT their finish report, finance report, and organizer report to the statistician within one working day. (motion 5/98)*

Any grievances by an organizer or judge should be in writing, postmarked no later than 72 hours after the end of the weight pull event, and sent to the Sanctioning Director who will present the written grievance(s) to the I.W.P.A. Board of Directors within two weeks of the receipt of the grievance, for deliberation.

Sanctioning applications that do not include the sanctioning fees will not be accepted. Exception-When faxing application a copy of the check/money order for sanctioning fees must be faxed with the application. The original application and check/money order for sanctioning fees must be postmarked within one working day of the fax. The original application and payment for sanctioning fees must be received by the sanctioning director no less than one week prior to the event or the sanctioning may be canceled.


Organizers of events which have had sanctioning suspended after the pull will be required to mail a reimbursement to all entrants of the \$5.00 per dog fee. This reimbursement must be mailed within 72 hours of the receipt of written notice by the Sanctioning Director of suspended sanctioning. (Failure to reimburse funds when sanctioning has been suspended may mean loss of future sanctioning of event by the organizer)

The Board of Directors may not make a decision on sanctioning a pull but will make a decision regarding any grievance filed in regard to sanctioning.

If the Sanctioning on a pull is refused or the sanctioning is withdrawn from a pull, the sanctioning director will notify the organizer in writing within 2 days. A phone call or fax is a courtesy but the "in writing" is a requirement.

Cancellations of a pull will be accepted with no penalty as long as there is ample time to report the cancellation in the newsletter with the same deadlines as for sanctioning a pull. If these deadlines are not met, the organizer shall (at their own expense) send out postcards to all members to notify them of the cancellation. If this is not one, an organizer may be subject to loss of sanctioning fees. There will be no provisions for "Rain Dates". I have read and understand the above rules regarding sanctioning.

Note: Renewing Judges <u>must sign and return this form</u> (with the proper fee) stating that you have read and understand the following changes in the IWPA Standing rules and Rule booklet that have been placed in effect at the board meeting on June 5, 2010. This also includes the **Judges Code of Conduct** that was adopted by the board in 2002.

International Weight Pull Association Judge Code of Conduct (Ethics and Authority)

1. You must both possess and project an unwavering air of integrity and ethical behavior that protects the reputation of IWPA pull events as fair and well-judged. With common sense, judges can easily avoid situations, which might raise ethical questions. A judge should avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety in all activities.

2.	Judges are presumed to be honest, competent and dedicated. Nevertheless, it is all too easy to
	find yourself in uncomfortable or even inappropriate situations. Guidelines cannot cover every
	situation, but they can help you avoid improprieties or perceived improprieties. A judge should
	perform the duties impartially and diligently. ("A judge shall disqualify himself or herself in a
	proceeding in which the judge's impartiality might reasonably be questioned, including but not
	limited to instances in which the judge has a personal bias or prejudice concerning a party")

3. You Are in Charge: As the Chief Judge, you have full authority over all persons in the event. With this authority comes the responsibility to be thoughtful and considerate. Be as systematic in

your procedure from dog to dog and weight class to weight class as conditions permit.

- 4. You should avoid theatrical movements or making inappropriate comments to competitors. Be polite, but generally limit your conversation with competitors to instructions that are in accordance with the IWPA rules.
- 5. The Judge may use whatever reasonable procedures he/she deems necessary to evaluate each dog's performance in an effective and efficient manner. The same procedures will be used to Judge each dog in a class. By entering any weight pull, the owner and handler of any dog agree to accept the decision of the Judge as final. The decision of a Judge is the responsibility of the Judge and not that of the IWPA.
- 6. IWPA events are intended to be family-oriented recreation for dog lovers and their dogs. Accordingly, IWPA expects the highest standard of conduct at all events.

Vaccinations

To keep your dog healthy, you need to ensure that he/she is vaccinated against common dog diseases. Your veterinarian will determine which vaccinations are necessary depending on variables such as her breed and your geographical area.

Common Dog Vaccinations

Rabies: The law in your state will determine the frequency of rabies vaccinations which should start when your dog is a puppy and will require a booster every one to three years thereafter.

Mixed vaccination: Distemper, Canine Infectious Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Parvovirus, and Coronavirus are commonly administered as a combined vaccine.

The chart below shows common vaccinations with the ages for first shots and frequency of boosters.
