

From the President:



From Judges' Chair Jean Wilson,

First, I'd like to thank all of our judges for taking on the responsibility of being an IWPA judge. It's an important and necessary position to ensure that all IWPA events held offer the same opportunity to all of our competitors and their dogs.

We're looking forward to another great season starting September 1 and the judge's renewal forms have been mailed out. If you have not received yours, be sure to contact me (text, phone or email) so I can ensure you receive yours. Remember that you must be a member before I can send your card out so avoid any delay by sending your membership application and the appropriate fee to the membership chair.

Last year I received quite a number of incomplete or inaccurate judge's reports. If there are extenuating circumstances that prevent you from complying with any of our rules, be sure to indicate that on the form with an explanation. This is very important. Not only do we need correct information on the report, falsifying these reports could jeopardize our insurance. Incomplete forms may be subject to being returned for completion.

There seems to be some misunderstanding regarding where the on deck area should be. Our rules state in Section 5-C-16: "There shall be a marked "on deck" area behind, but near the starting end of the pull chute. This marked area shall house only the next dog to pull." It cannot be inside the chute area. This ensures that everyone has the same advantage/disadvantage than any other competitor within the IWPA.

We've also been hearing a number of concerns regarding aggressive dogs. This is truly a safety issue and an aggressive dog cannot be tolerated. Section 4-B of the IWPA rules states: "Vicious or unmanageable dogs shall be barred from competition." It is up to the judge's discretion if they deem a dog fits this profile and the dog can be disqualified. Also noted in Section 4-B is: "All dogs shall be under physical control, while in the pull area, except when hooked to the sled or cart." Dogs will need to be either leashed or physically held onto by someone. Anywhere else during the event if they are not in the holding area, they need to be under physical control or contained in some manner (crate, vehicle, tie-out, etc.)

I am a huge advocate for communication. If you have any questions at all, don't hesitate to reach out to me. I try my best to get back to everyone in the shortest time frame possible. Thanks again and let's have another great pulling season!

2018-2019 Board Meeting Indianapolis, IN June 1 – 2, 2019

Meeting called to order by President Sue Ferrari at 7:15 AM.

Roll Call – Those present were President Sue Ferrari (2nd year 1st term), Vice President Brenda Lemon (1st year 2nd term), Secretary to the Board Robbie Reed, Treasurer Cheryl Martin (1st year 1st term), Valarie Thawley (1st year 2nd term), Susan Gallagher (2nd year 2nd term), George Ferrari (1st year 2nd term), Bob Sencenbaugh (1st year 2nd term) and guest Jennifer Berning. Absent Sheryl Franklin (2nd year 2nd term) and Jean Wilson (2nd year 1st term).

Meeting minutes previously approved after the 2018 board meeting. Minutes not read.

Board reports

Secretary Robbie Reed provided a written report outlining all items that the board voted on during the season. Motion by Bob Sencenbaugh, second by Brenda Lemon, motion/second/carried.

Treasurer Cheryl Martin provided a written report including current financials. Motion by Bob Sencenbaugh, second by Brenda Lemon, motion/second/carried.

Committee Reports

Membership Rodney Martin was absent but submitted a written report which was presented by Cheryl Martin. In brief there were a total of 135 total memberships for the 2018-2019 season, which is up 6 memberships from last season.

Sanctioning Sue Ferrari - written report presented. In brief, 113 total pulls were sanctioned including Championship. One pull was canceled due to horrible weather conditions, 1 canceled after the venue was sold and no longer available, and 3 were canceled after weigh in because no one showed up.

Judges Robbie Reed advised Jean Wilson will present her Judges report and requested this be tabled until 3:30PM when Jean will be available via telephone; tabled.

Forms Robbie Reed - written report presented. In brief, all forms updated and saved as PDF and fillable if needed.

Awards Jennifer Berning - written report presented. In brief Jennifer received and completed 8 working dog applications. Completed and mailed out Championship invites. Also, will need to order Regional medals as we do not have enough on hand to award next season.

Grievance Bob Sencenbaugh - written report presented. No grievances filed.

Personnel Brenda Lemon - no issues with personnel.

Championship Valarie Thawley - written report presented. In brief 64 dogs competed during the snow competition and 70 dogs competed in the wheels competition. Two records were broken on wheels; Throttle in the 60 lb class pulling 3985 lbs and Delbert in the 150 lb class pulling 3800 lbs. First time records were created on natural wheels and snow by 10 lb class Monarch Joseph. Monarch Joseph pulled 42 lbs on natural snow and 295 lbs on natural

wheels. Also, Terry and Robbie Reed sponsored high percentage plaques for each weight class for both snow and wheels. Rodney and Cheryl Martin sponsored two day combined high percentage trophies. The winners are in the 10/20/40 pound classes was Magic Mike with owner Clay Fonvielle. The 60/80/100 pound classes was Mole with owner/handlers Steve Jackson and Wendy Leister. And in the 125/150/Unlimited classes was Xander with owner Timothy Goodell.

Newsletter Robbie Reed - written report presented. In brief the average cost for printing the newsletter for each membership went up to \$56.58. This cost does not include the cost of printing the Constitution and Pulling Rules and mailing them to each membership. This is an increase of \$6.02 each membership just for the newsletter. From the 2013-2014 season through the 2018-2019 season the increase for printing all IWPA documents has increased over 65%.

Regional Coordinator Susan Gallagher - written report presented. In brief Susan indicated she received no reports from regions. Clay Fonvielle will be the Region 8 rep.

Statistician Sue Ferrari - written report presented. In brief there were stats received for 108 pulls which includes Championship pulls. Late fines were assessed to two organizers; this amount totaled \$350.00. Points were pulled on one pull due to numerous rules that were broken. On another pull, points were pulled on the chief judge only.

Web Master Sheryl Franklin - written report submitted by Sheryl Franklin and presented Sue Ferrari. Updates to all sections of website except the Gallery. Sheryl indicated she hadn't received any photos until March/April. She had received comments in regard to corrections to individual pulls, questions/disagreements with points, and requests for contact information which she directed to the contact page, corrections with upcoming pulls and fielded questions on where to send forms for organizers. Sheryl added since adding the FAQ to the website 3 years ago, the questions have diminished.

Web site inquiry Brenda Lemon – no written report but Brenda indicated she had approximately 6 inquiries.

HOF Robbie Reed - written report presented. Robbie reported she had 6 Regional HOF applications which were presented during the Awards Banquet at Championships. The recipients were Denali with Owners Mike and Kathleen Tully, Daffodil, Chief and Tog "The Terrible" with Owners Rodney and Cheryl Martin and Prince Mufasa with Owners Robbie and Terry Reed. No National HOF applications were submitted. There were two applications for International HOF which will need to be reviewed under old business. Those applicants are Daffodil with Owners Rodney and Cheryl Martin and Prince Mufasa with Owners Robbie and Terry Reed. There was 1 National Hall of Fame Inductee presented to the membership during the Awards Banquet on April 27th, 2019; that Inductee was Cinnabar with Owner/Handler Sheryl Franklin. There were 3 International Hall of Fame Inductees presented to the membership during the Awards Banquet on April 27th, 2019; those Inductees were Keisha with Owner/Handler Kari Hunyadi, Ricochet with Owner/Handler Diane Krupski and Prince I-Da Mack with Owner/Handler Terry Reed. Now, after the sixth completed season since the birth of the Hall of Fame program in 2012-2013 season there are a total of 34 Regional HOF recipients, 5 National HOF Inductees, as well as 11 International HOF Inductees with 2 pending applicants. For a total of 50 awarded HOF and 2 pending HOF awards.

Promotions Terry Reed - written report submitted from Terry Reed and presented by Sue Ferrari and Robbie Reed. In brief, Terry Reed reported he had two marketing ventures; one with an IWPA logo baseball hat and the second

was an online store selling shirts with the IWPA logo. From both ventures the IWPA earned \$188.06.

Cheryl Martin made a motion to accept all committee reports as presented. Second by Valarie Thawley, motion/second/carried.

Drug Testing Robbie Reed - written report presented. In brief drug testing was completed at the Championships. There were 51 urine samples submitted to the lab for testing/analysis. The lab indicated two samples had confirmed positive findings for a total of three stimulants (two stimulants each with one being in both samples) which is a violation of our rules; Pulling Rules Section 4 (A) (3). Additionally, two of the compounds are toxic for dogs which is a violation of our rules; Pulling Rules Section 4 (B). It is important to note that both samples were not identified in any way nor were the owners/handlers during the discussion of this committee report. After much discussion and education information provided, Susan Gallagher made a motion that the 2 positive samples lead to disqualification of the dogs and any dogs placing lower than these disqualified dogs be moved up one position. Also, further discussion to follow for owner/handler responsibility and repercussions, second by Brenda Lemon, motion/second/carried unanimously.

Bob Sencenbaugh made a motion to remain consistent, issue a like penalty (from a previous positive finding) for these violations, to return medals if issued and the membership/s suspended for 3 years. Letter previously issued be modified for correct information and the owners/handlers be notified via certified mail. Second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried unanimously.

Unfinished Business

Newsletter costs reviewed. Bob Sencenbaugh made a motion to increase all membership dues by \$5.00. Grant a \$10 discount for all memberships that accept the Newsletter by PDF format, second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried.

International HOF Induction reviews for Daffodil and Prince Mufasa. Motion made by Bob Sencenbaugh to induct both Daffodil and Prince Mufasa into the International HOF, second by Valarie Thawley, motion/second/carried.

Items from the General Membership meeting

From the topic of re-alignment of regions and the number of pulls in/out of region to be counted for points. After much discussion and reminded of information from the board meeting in 2017-18, it was decided no changes needed, it would not benefit the membership as a whole.

From Debbie Lee in regard to a form change for judges; topic tabled until forms review under new business.

Follow up/update on IRS/Not for Profit and PayPal. Treasurer Cheryl Martin advised there have been no problems using PayPal and the process is getting much better. Cheryl replies to sender after she receives the funds notification. Cheryl has no issues with receiving a scanned signature but not sent as a picture text msg. Update on IRS/Not for Profit status - Sue advised she had looked at and made notes but hadn't done anything else with it. Cheryl feels we do need to get this but doesn't feel she is qualified to do the filing on her own. Cheryl will reach out to a CPA and check on cost to help with filing.

Job description update tabled for new business.

Audit of financials/checking/savings accounts – Cheryl Martin reported an audit hasn't been completed. The board set a date of July 15th for it to be completed before the beginning of the pull season.

Eileen Rogers member letter of concern – Sue Ferrari explained a video came to light with obvious rule violations. She called all judges except 1. All agreed Steve always park there (in front of the start line). One person in attendance said the track was not 10' wide but the organizer said it was. Sue added she initially said she wouldn't pull points. Based on what's on the back of sanctioning application and the letter sent to all organizers specifically states point can be pulled. Susan Gallagher asked why she waited until after season was over to pull the points. Susan added they could have had the opportunity to make up the points. Sue Ferrari advised Jean Wilson was still conducting her investigation as Judges Chair. Sue added she had sent the information out to the board for input and all replying board members agreed a letter should be sent but no one input on what should be written. Discussion came up about this being taken to the board meeting for further discussion. Valarie Thawley said she understood a letter had been sent out for judges. Didn't realize the Sanctioning Chair could pull the points alone.

Sue Ferrari said the job description will be brought up under new business.

Susan Gallagher talked about the time frame needs to happen faster for any points to be pulled.

In regard to judges portion this should be tabled until 3:30 PM to discuss with Jean Wilson.

Eileen Rogers also questioned cart weights for specific pulls 17, 18, 42, 43, 56, 57, 94, 95, 106, 26, 27 and 28. Eileen states the cart weight and the number in increments don't add up to the weight pulled. After reviewing all the pulls the cart used weighed 265 pounds. Simply, an additional 35 pounds is added to the cart bringing the cart weight up to an even number for the beginning start weight; i.e. cart weight is 265 pounds add an additional 35 pounds to the cart bringing it to 300 pounds. So the starting weight and weight increments are even numbers.

In regard to snow fence chutes, a letter will be sent to John Podolak regarding his chute barriers as per Pulling Rules Section 2 (d) no snow fence and appropriate materials are listed. He also needs to revise his chute barriers to be within the rules. Sue Ferrari to write a letter to John Podolak.

Eileen questioned the Treasurer Financial statements placed into the newsletter, indicating the verbiage is incorrect. Cheryl Martin said she can change the wording of "budget" to "Financial Statement" and General Fund will change to "Income" and "Expenses".

Will look at setting up grievance committee to investigate any investigation even if a grievance isn't filed. Placed on New Business.

David Gallagher submitted a letter. Susan Gallagher said all things had been addressed during previous discussion.

Michelle Izzo letter submitted to the board in regard to the Remsen pull which was reviewed; no action needed.

Sue Ferrari explained at this pull, Mist attempted the pull the cart and couldn't pull it. After that the cart was changed and the pull started over. Susan Gallagher asked if every dog in the class tried to pull it and couldn't, if then they could have changed the cart? Robbie Reed advised there was a championship where all dogs in the 20 lb class tried to pull and no dog pulled it; no medals were issued at that championship. The pull simply can't just restart. Keeping consistent this should not be allowed at any pull event.

Darwin Lumbattis letter submitted asking about the number of out of region pulls allowed. This had already been addressed; no changes needed.

Susan Gallagher submitted agenda items via email. Susan Gallagher explained 3 items are under new business; social media, cell phone and how those issues are addressed in the future. Drug testing issue already addressed will review for job description and collection.

Susan Gallagher topic of a foul language issue at the championships. Topic tabled until discussion with Jean Wilson for Judges Report at 3:30 PM.

Susan Gallagher questioned any DQ at Championships. Sue Ferrari explained the DQ of Chewy. Sue told Carol she couldn't go out of the handling area. Carol took Chewy a second time out of the holding area. A third time she went out of the holding area Sue Ferrari realized when the dog was out of the area it wasn't even on a leash. Jennifer Berning explained Carol would walk behind her as she was judging the class and never saw Carol doing this because she was calling for the next dog/handler to the track. Sue added Debbie Lee told Carol she needed to watch herself or will be DQ'd. The timing of the DQ was unfortunate. The DQ was not an issue, just the timing it was called was unfortunate.

Sue Ferrari explained the DQ of Tank, where he was not being manageable. Sue Ferrari talked to Darwin and told him if the dog could not be managed, don't bring him out to the track. Jennifer Berning also explained when Tank was hooked to cart he had turned the cart in almost 180 degree angle and a tangle was called. The dog was unhooked and hooked back up and attempted to pull. As the pull began the dog began it bite Darwin's arm. Darwin took the dog out that round. Jennifer added her and Jean both were headed to Darwin when he told them he's taking Tank out.

Also, a dogs Harness too long at Championship. George Ferrari explained Shae-la Gatz' boyfriend asked about Tim Goodell's dog harness being too long. George asked Tim Goodell about the length. Tim told him it was okay. George measured the harness and found it to be 26". George Ferrari asked if he knew it was too long and Tim said no. George Ferrari told Tim to change the harnesses. The same two people ask about "yesterday's" pull. George asked about why they didn't say something yesterday. Susan Gallagher felt Tim should have been DQ'd. New business tighten up where measurement is made specifically from.

Brenda Lemon made a motion to visit new business items with the exception that board members present that will be vacating current board positions not vote on any new business discussed and any new board members present coming on the new board, be able to cast votes for new business taken out of order due to extenuating circumstances. Second by Cheryl Martin, motion/second/carried.

New Business

Proposed new Budget Treasurer Cheryl Martin – Cheryl said she will change "General Fund" to "Income" and "Expenses" and "Proposed Budget" to "Financial Statement". Bob Sencenbaugh made a motion to accept proposed budget, second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried.

General membership meeting items;

Steven Gatzow in regard to re-alignment of regions. This topic was discussed and no change needed.

Darwin Lumbattis in regard to the number of pulls allowed to count in points. This topic was discussed and no change needed.

Debbie Lee suggestion about a change on the Judges Report; to be addressed under forms.

Sue Ferrari discussed the holding area Judge measure the harnesses for each dog prior to the weight class beginning. Will use the score sheet and mark on the score sheet after the dog is measured and it fit within the 24". Discussed adding in to Pulling Rules Section 5 (c) before number 1, "While in the holding area the harness of each dog competing in the weight class MUST be measured by a judge to ensure that each harness measures less than 24" from the base of the tail to the farthest extent of the harness when measured approximately parallel to the ground". All subsequent numbers in the aforementioned paragraph continue in numerical order. Motion made by Cheryl Martin, second by Valarie Thawley, motion/second/carried.

Sue Ferrari – Judges Report not being filled out correctly. Topic discussed and suggested the judge's chair for 19-20 season write an article for the August Newsletter advising all about importance of filling out paperwork correctly. If not, it would be falsifying documents and could jeopardize insurance.

Sue Ferrari – money set aside for a person to visit pulls to help ensure rules are enforced uniformly the same all over the IWPA venues.

Sue Ferrari - Pulling Rules 5 (c) 16. Discussed on deck circle. Add to the Judges Chairperson letter for the August Newsletter that the on deck circle be "behind, but near the starting end of the pull chute" as stated in the Pulling Rules.

Sue Ferrari made a suggestion that all board members being more professional, putting personal issues aside and looking at the bigger picture for the whole organization.

Terry Reed written and submitted proposal to add in Standing Rules Article III Section 7 (I) change to read "The organizer and first year judges shall not be eligible to judge at the Championship". Bob Sencenbaugh made a motion to accept as written, second by Jennifer Berning, motion/second/carried.

Terry Reed written and submitted proposal Standing Rules Article III Section 7 - Bob Sencenbaugh motioned Standing Rules Article III Section 7 (K) to become proposed "M" and current letters K & L become L & M, second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried.

Jennifer Berning Standing Rules Article III Section 5 change to read "...snow pullers against snow pullers...", motion by Jennifer Berning, second by Valarie Thawley, motion/second/carried.

Terry Reed Article II Sec 4 written proposal submitted. It suggests to add proposed letter A and letter B. Bob Sencenbaugh motioned to accept as written except remove the second paragraph of number 3, second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried.

Standing Rules Article II section 1 – discussed as written. Change by adding on to letter D – "If sanctioning is possibly going to be suspended, the sanctioning director will present all evidence and justification to the board for review and/or approval". Jennifer Berning made a motion to add number 1 with changes noted, "Financial" and changes as noted to letter D by adding the aforementioned statement, second by Valarie Thawley, motion/second/carried.

Jean Wilson called to give Judges Report. After a lengthy discussion regarding Shae-la Gatz/Kruger's disqualification in regard to failure to report to the drug testing table, it was decided that no action to be taken.

Board discussed social media conversations, cyber bullying. George Ferrari made a motion to add to Standing Rules Article XIV Section 4 (after the first sentence) "A grievance could include but not limited to verified direct communication via cyber bullying, any form of digital communication, direct threats and harassment", second by Bob Sencenbaugh, motion/second/carried.

Same Article XIV Grievance Section 3 change the time frame of 2 to 4 weeks to "2 to 3 weeks". Also add "once all evidence is submitted to the board, the board has 1 week to make a decision and notify all parties. Brenda Lemon made a motion to adopt changes, second by Jennifer Berning, motion/second/carried.

Terry Reed written and submitted proposal Standing Rules Article II Section 7 - to add in a Section H (which is copied from Constitution By-laws Article IV Section 3 D Nominations) and add in 2 sentences as noted in bold on his proposal, "The Election Chairperson shall on or before January 5th, mail, (by first class mail) to each member in good standing, a ballot listing all of the nominees for each position in alphabetical order, together with a blank envelope marked ballot for each voting member and a return envelope addressed to Elections Chair marked Ballot and bearing the name of the member to whom it was sent. In order that the ballots may remain secret, each voter after making his ballot shall seal it in the blank envelope, which in turn shall be placed in the second envelope addressed to the Election Chair. (Add In) The outer envelope shall bear the signature of the member. Members at their discretions and expense may place the entire package in an additional envelope to conceal their signature when mailing. The inspectors of the election shall check the returns against the list of members whose dues are paid for the coming year prior to the opening the outer envelopes and removing the blank ballot envelopes, and shall certify the eligibility of the voters as well as the results of the voting. Ballots must be returned on or before February 15th. Notification of the results of voting will be published in the March Newsletter. Valarie Thawley made a motion to accept proposed, second by Brenda Lemon, motion/second/carried.

Susan Gallagher asked about (a) the determination of the championship location and (b) Canadian membership; discussed no further discussion needed.

Robbie Reed - Pulling Rules Section 4 (3) add on the word "oxygenators" after the words i.e. illegal stimulants.... George Ferrari made a motion to add as noted, second by Bob Sencenbaugh, motion/second/carried.

Robbie Reed to ask Terry Reed to work on the missing job descriptions in Standing Rules Article II Sections 5, 6, 12, 13, 15, and 17.

Discipline of Judges Steve Jackson and Diane Geitzenhaur (Article VII Section 3). George Ferrari suggests Steve and Diane receive probation for 1 pulling season to begin their next pulling season, as this is the second occurrence for each of them. Written warning letters to go out to Wendy Leister, Merrillee D'Anonio, Beverly Detwiler and Eileen Rogers. Judges Chair to draft the letters and then send to the board for approval. Motion made by Brenda Lemon, second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried.

The Judges chair to add in their article for the August Newsletter about issues with aggressive dogs and it won't be tolerated.

A letter from the board addressed to all judges for the 2018-2019 season regarding all the issues from this season. Sue Ferrari to draft the letter and send to board for review/approval.

Bob Sencenbaugh motion to re-elect the current officers (2018-2019) as nominations to fill officer positions for the 2019-2020 officers. President Sue Ferrari, Vice-President Brenda Lemon, Secretary to the Board Robbie Reed and Treasurer Cheryl Martin all accepted nominations. Second made by Jennifer Berning, motion/second/carried.

Committee Chair Persons – George Ferrari to fill Elections, Bob Sencenbaugh to fill Regional Coordinator and all other committee chairs remain the same.

Forms review - Robbie Reed to make changes as noted. Motion made by Brenda Lemon to accept all changes as noted, second by Bob Sencenbaugh, motion/second/carried.

Sheryl Franklin video conference. Sue Ferrari to contact Sheryl Franklin to inquire about which 2 programs she would suggest. Then the secretary to set up trial periods for evaluation and testing.

Board meeting 2020 tentative date/location - Reno, NV on June 13th & 14th, 2020. Bob Sencenbaugh made a motion to accept date and location, second by George Ferrari, motion/second/carried.

Bob Sencenbaugh made a motion to adjourn meeting, second by Jennifer Berning, motion/second/carried.

INTERNATIONAL WEIGHT PULL ASSOCIATION WEIGHT PULL STANDING RULES ON SANCTIONING

In order for your pull to be sanctioned and to count for points.

Any organization who wishes to put on a pull approved by the I.W.P.A. shall require the organizer or any of the officials to have an I.W.P.A. membership and use I.W.P.A. weight pull rules which include having an I.W.P.A. certified and approved judge.

A sanctioning application must be filled out by the organizer and delivered into the hands of the I.W.P.A. sanctioning director no later than the 15th of the month preceding the month in which the event is to take place, provided the event is scheduled between the 15th through the end of any given month. Pulls scheduled from the 1st through the 14th of any month must be received no later than the 15th of the month two months prior to the weight pull event. For example, an event scheduled for December 7th must be received no later than October 15th, an event scheduled for December 28th must be received no later than November 15th. No exceptions to this rule will be made!! It is the organizer's responsibility to ascertain if this application has been received by the Sanctioning Director.

Newsletter pull calendar information is taken from the sanctioning application; therefore, ALL questions must be answered. It may be considered false advertising for any organizer to falsify or fail to follow the information provided on the sanctioning request. False advertising will be grounds for placing the organizer on probationary sanctioning status.

The following list of information from your weight pull must be sent to the **Sanctioning Director** with a **postmark no later than 7 days** after the last day of your pull:

- 1. Weight Pull finish report
- 2. Organizer's report
- 3. Financial report with ALL monies due the IWPA for the \$5.00 per dog fee, For pulls held in Canada \$5.00 are payable in U.S. funds only. (Motion6/07)
- 4. All regular and provisional membership monies received at your pull with completed membership forms must be sent to the <u>Membership</u> <u>Director</u> with a <u>postmark no later than 7 days</u> after the last day of your pull. New members are to be given the membership receipt included in your packet as proof of membership until their card is sent to them.
- 5. Send Judge's Reports and Handlers Meeting Registration to the Judge Chairperson

(The penalty for failure to meet the 7 day postmark requirement will result in a fine of not less than \$20.00 and \$5.00 per day for each day after 6 days that the pull results are not postmarked. Failure to pay a fine may result in loss of sanctioning and/or points). Exception—Organizers of pulls held the last two weeks of the season are required to submit finish reports to the sanctioning director and E-MAIL (06/18) or OVERNIGHT their finish report, finance report, and organizer report to the statistician within one working day. (5/98)

Any grievances by an organizer or judge should be in writing, postmarked no later than 72 hours after the end of the weight pull event, and sent to the Sanctioning Director who will present the written grievance(s) to the I.W.P.A. Board of Directors within two weeks of the receipt of the grievance, for deliberation.

Sanctioning applications that do not include the sanctioning fees will not be accepted. Exception-When E-MAILING application a copy of the check/money order for sanctioning fees must be E-MAILED with the application. The original application and check/money order for sanctioning fees must be postmarked within one working day of the E-MAIL. The original application and payment for sanctioning fees must be received by the sanctioning director no less than one week prior to the event or the sanctioning may be canceled.

Organizers of events which have had sanctioning suspended after the pull will be required to mail a reimbursement to all entrants of the \$5.00 per dog fee. This reimbursement must be mailed within 72 hours of the receipt of written notice by the Sanctioning Director of suspended sanctioning. (Failure to reimburse funds when sanctioning has been suspended may mean loss of future sanctioning of event by the organizer)

The Board of Directors may not make a decision on sanctioning a pull but will make a decision regarding any grievance filed in regard to sanctioning.

If the Sanctioning on a pull is refused or the sanctioning is withdrawn from a pull, the sanctioning director will notify the organizer in writing within 2 days. A phone call or E-MAIL is a courtesy but the "in writing" is a requirement.

Cancellations of a pull will be accepted with no penalty as long as there is ample time to report the cancellation in the newsletter with the same deadlines as for sanctioning a pull. If these deadlines are not met, the organizer shall (at their own expense) send out postcards to all members to notify them of the cancellation. If this is not one, an organizer *will* be subject to loss of sanctioning fees. (06/17) There will be no provisions for "Rain Dates". I have read and understand the above rules regarding sanctioning.

Dogs and Chocolate

A small amount of **chocolate** will probably only give your **dog** an upset stomach with vomiting or diarrhea. With large amounts, theobromine can produce muscle tremors, seizures, an irregular heartbeat, internal bleeding or a heart attack. The onset of theobromine poisoning is usually marked by severe hyperactivity.



Chocolate is poisonous to dogs; however, the hazard of chocolate to your dog depends on the type of chocolate, the amount consumed and your dog's size. In large enough amounts, chocolate and cocoa products can kill your dog.

Why not chocolate?

The toxic component of chocolate is theobromine. Humans easily metabolize theobromine, but dogs process it much more slowly, allowing it to build up to toxic levels in their system.

A large dog can consume more chocolate than a small dog before suffering ill effects.

A small amount of chocolate will probably only give your dog an upset stomach with vomiting or diarrhea.

With large amounts, theobromine can produce muscle tremors, seizures, an irregular heartbeat, internal bleeding or a heart attack. The onset of theobromine poisoning is usually marked by severe hyperactivity.

The usual treatment for theobromine poisoning is to induce vomiting within two hours of ingestion. If you are worried or suspect that your dog may have eaten a large quantity of chocolate and they are showing any of the signs listed above, call your veterinarian immediately.

If you have a small dog that has eaten a box of chocolates, you need to call and go to your veterinarian right away. Do not wait

Different chocolate types have different theobromine levels. Cocoa, cooking chocolate and dark chocolate contain the highest levels, while milk chocolate and white chocolate have the lowest. If you're dealing with any quantity of dark or bitter chocolate, err on the side of caution. The high level of theobromine in dark chocolate means it takes only a very small amount to poison a dog. Less than an ounce of dark chocolate may be enough to poison a 44-pound dog.

Of course, never consider chocolate as a reward.

Dog owners often ask **how much chocolate** can **kill a dog**. While there is no right or wrong answer to this, we know **dogs** show symptoms of poisoning when they eat 20mg of theobromine (the toxic chemical in **chocolate**) for every kilogram they weigh. These symptoms become severe at 40 to 50mg per kg.

"The amount of **toxic** theobromine varies with the type of **chocolate**." **Toxic** doses of theobromine are reported to be as low as 20 mg/kg, where agitation, hyperactivity and gastrointestinal signs (such as drooling, vomiting, and diarrhea - all which may smell like **chocolate**) can be seen.

1/3 pound can be poisonous for a 20 pound dog and 1/6 pound for a **10 pound** dog. The average **chocolate** bar contains 2 to 3 ounces of milk **chocolate**. It **would** take 2-3 candy bars to poison a 10 pound **dog**. ... A small candy bar might cause an upset stomach resulting in diarrhea or vomiting.

In cases of **chocolate ingestion**, the veterinarian will often give a solution of activated charcoal orally to absorb any remaining theobromine from the gastrointestinal tract. After vomiting induction and/or charcoal **treatment**, your pet will need to be monitored for symptoms for 4-6 hours.

Theobromine, a caffeine like molecule that increases blood flow to the brain, is so hard for **dogs** to process that they can easily **eat** enough to be poisonous. Few **dogs eat** fatal amounts of **chocolate**, but smaller doses can still cause seizures and other symptoms.

Types of Chocolate

Dogs are most likely to consume chocolate around Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, and Easter, says Dr. Judy Morgan, DVM, a holistic veterinarian at Clayton and Churchtown Veterinary Associates in New Jersey. However, you should always be vigilant and not leave chocolate products where a curious dog might find them.

Theobromine is the ingredient in chocolate that's toxic to dogs, Morgan says. Different types of chocolate have varying amounts of theobromine, so their toxicity levels will vary. There are also other ingredients, like sugar, that are often combined with chocolate that can also be harmful to dogs.

White chocolate

Of the chocolates listed here, white chocolate has the lowest levels of theobromine, but that doesn't mean your dog is in the all clear after chowing down: Morgan says the amount of sugar in white chocolate could be harmful, too.

"[It] could cause vomiting and diarrhea, possibly *pancreatitis*, but not the heart problems associated with theobromine," she says.

Milk chocolate

Milk chocolate is found in a variety of items you might have in your pantry, including candy from Halloween or Valentine's Day. While it does contain theobromine, the levels are lower than in dark and backing chocolate, Morgan says.

"Large volumes of mild chocolate generally result in vomiting and diarrhea," she says.

Dark chocolate

Both dark chocolate and baking chocolate can be harmful to dogs in much small amounts than milk or white chocolate. The symptoms can be severe: Morgan says fast and irregular heartbeats are likely to occur. Additional issues include tremors, seizures, and possibly death, according to the American Kennel Club (AKC).

Baking chocolate

Baking chocolate can cause the most harm to dogs due its levels of theobromine. Additional problems can occur if the baking chocolate was consumed in the form of baked goods such as cake or brownies.

"If the baked goods also contain raisins or macadamia nuts, it's even more trouble," Morgan says. "Added sugar in the baked goods will contribute to vomiting, diarrhea, and possibly pancreatitis."

Like with dark chocolate, heart issues can occur when dogs eat even a small amount of baking chocolate.

What to Do if Your Dog Has Ingested Chocolate

If you didn't see your dog actually eat the chocolate, it can be difficult to pinpoint when it happened. The ASPCA says symptoms don't necessarily occur immediately, and can happen up to eight hours after the chocolate was consumed.

"The first step is really to figure out how much the dog ate," Morgan says. "If it only ate a small amount of milk chocolate, veterinary intervention is probably not needed. If the dog ate quite a bit of baking or dark chocolate, definitely contact a veterinarian."

Keep in mind that the amount of chocolate that can cause harm to a dog with less body weight is smaller and that older dogs or dogs with a previous heart condition might react to the chocolate differently, according to the AKC.

Chocolate contains caffeine. Caffeine is a stimulant, a compound not allowed by the IWPA for your dogs to consume. It also contains the obromine, the compound in chocolate that makes it TOXIC to your dogs. The obromine is also a stimulant and not allowed for your dogs to consume. Chocolate also contains the ophylline, it too is a stimulant which is not allowed for your dogs to consume. **Refer to Pulling Rules Section 4 (A)(3).**

FDA: Do Not Buy or Feed ANY Pig Ear Pet Treats

July 31, 2019 — In the wake of 2 recent and related recalls, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration is <u>advising consumers</u> to <u>avoid buying or feeding all pig ear pet treats</u>... and for retailers to stop selling these products.



What Caused the FDA Alert?

Together with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the FDA is investigating a suspected link between pig ear pet treats and human cases of salmonellosis.

As of July 31, 2019, the CDC reports that there are now 127 cases of human infection tied to exposure to pig ear pet treats with Salmonella.

Twenty-six people have been hospitalized. There are no reported deaths.

The FDA has traced back some of the pig ear treats associated with cases of illness to sources in Argentina and Brazil.



Since July 3, 2019, The Dog Food Advisor has published 2 recall notices related to this FDA alert:

Pet Supplies Plus Recalls Pig Ears Dog Treats

Lennox International Recalls Pig Ears Dog Treats

The FDA is working with impacted firms to remove pig ear pet treats from the market and identify places where they may have been distributed.

The investigation is ongoing. The FDA will provide the public with new information as it becomes available.

What to Do?

The FDA and CDC are recommending that people avoid buying or feeding any pig ear pet treats at this time.

If you have pig ear pet treats, safely discard them and thoroughly clean the areas where the treats have been.
