





2020 – 2021: Mid West (Regions 3, 9)


2021 – 2022: Mid East (Regions 4, 6, 8)


Word to the wise about SPAMMERS!!!

However, if you right click over the name you should be given several options. Click view contact, it will show the email address that actually sent the email. So, if you receive an e-mail from someone you are not expecting an e-mail from DO NOT OPEN ANY LINKS THAT MAY HAVE BEEN SENT!!!! If you do, you probably will activate the download of a virus!!! You may want to send the person an e-mail to a known e-mail address for them and ask if they sent you an e-mail.

Also, mark any suspicious e-mails as SPAM!!!

If you suspect catching a computer virus be sure to take your computer to a professional and have it checked!! The money spent on the front end may save you a very large expense if ignored!!!

International Weight Pull Association Working Dog Degree Program

Your dog must meet the criteria below to be eligible for the various working dog degrees. When your dog has achieved the required number of pulls for a degree (at an IWPA Sanctioned or IWPA Approved pull) and you have completed the application forms for each pull, send the forms and \$10 U.S. Funds for each certificate requested to the Working Dog Chairperson, after September 1. Your certificate will be mailed to the address on the application form. Please complete all blanks on the forms to aid in the processing of the certificates. All pulls required for a certificate must be achieved in no more than two consecutive program years. The program year is from September 1 to August 31 the following year.

Requirements for Certificates

- 1. IWPA Working Dog: the dog must pull 5 times its own body weight in 4 different pulls on snow.
- 2. IWPA Working Dog Excellent: the dog must pull 10 times its own body weight in 4 different pulls on snow.
- 3. IWPA Working Dog Superior: the dog must pull 15 times its own body weight in 3 different pulls on snow.

Wheels

- 1. IWPA Working Dog: the dog must pull 12 times its own body weight in 4 different pulls on wheels.
- IWPA Working Dog Excellent: the dog must pull 18 times its own body weight in 4 different pulls on wheels.
- 3. IWPA Working Dog Superior: the dog must pull 23 times its own body weight in 3 different pulls on wheels.

INTERNATIONAL WEIGHT PULL ASSOCIATION WEIGHT PULL STANDING RULES ON SANCTIONING

In order for your pull to be sanctioned and to count for points.

Any organization who wishes to put on a pull approved by the I.W.P.A. shall require the organizer or any of the officials to have an I.W.P.A. membership and use I.W.P.A. weight pull rules which include having an I.W.P.A. certified and approved judge.

A sanctioning application must be filled out by the organizer and delivered into the hands of the I.W.P.A. sanctioning director no later than the 15th of the month preceding the month in which the event is to take place, provided the event is scheduled between the 15th through the end of any given month. Pulls scheduled from the 1st through the 14th of any month must be received no later than the 15th of the month two months prior to the weight pull event. For example, an event scheduled for December 7th must be received no later than October 15th, an event scheduled for December 28th must be received no later than November 15th. No exceptions to this rule will be made!! It is the organizer's responsibility to ascertain if this application has been received by the Sanctioning Director.

Newsletter pull calendar information is taken from the sanctioning application; therefore, ALL questions must be answered. It may be considered false advertising for any organizer to falsify or fail to follow the information provided on the sanctioning request. False advertising will be grounds for placing the organizer on probationary sanctioning status.

The following list of information from your weight pull must be sent to the Sanctioning Director with a postmark no later than 7 days after the last day of your pull:

- 1. Weight Pull finish report
- 2. Organizer's report
- Financial report with ALL monies due the IWPA for the \$5.00 per dog fee, For pulls held in Canada \$5.00 are payable in U.S. funds only. (Motion6/07)
- 4. All regular and provisional membership monies received at your pull with completed membership forms must be sent to the <u>Membership Director</u> with a <u>postmark no later than 7 days</u> after the last day of your pull. New members are to be given the membership <u>receipt included in your packet</u> as proof of membership until their card is sent to them.
- 5. Send Judge's Reports and Handlers Meeting Registration to the Judge Chairperson

(The penalty for failure to meet the 7 day postmark requirement will result in a fine of not less than \$20.00 and \$5.00 per day for each day after 6 days that the pull results are not postmarked. Failure to pay a fine may result in loss of sanctioning and/or points). Exception—Organizers of pulls held the last two weeks of the season are required to submit finish reports to the sanctioning director and E-MAIL (06/18) or OVERNIGHT their finish report, finance report, and organizer report to the statistician within one working day. (5/98)

Any grievances by an organizer or judge should be in writing, postmarked no later than 72 hours after the end of the weight pull event, and sent to the Sanctioning Director who will present the written grievance(s) to the I.W.P.A. Board of Directors within two weeks of the receipt of the grievance, for deliberation.

Sanctioning applications that do not include the sanctioning fees will not be accepted. Exception-When E-MAILING application a copy of the check/money order for sanctioning fees must be E-MAILED with the application. The original application and check/money order for sanctioning fees must be postmarked within one working day of the E-MAIL. The original application and payment for sanctioning fees must be received by the sanctioning director no less than one week prior to the event or the sanctioning may be canceled.

Organizers of events which have had sanctioning suspended after the pull will be required to mail a reimbursement to all entrants of the \$5.00 per dog fee. This reimbursement must be mailed within 72 hours of the receipt of written notice by the Sanctioning Director of suspended sanctioning. (Failure to reimburse funds when sanctioning has been suspended may mean loss of future sanctioning of event by the organizer)

The Board of Directors may not make a decision on sanctioning a pull but will make a decision regarding any grievance filed in regard to sanctioning.

If the Sanctioning on a pull is refused or the sanctioning is withdrawn from a pull, the sanctioning director will notify the organizer in writing within 2 days. A phone call or E-MAIL is a courtesy but the "in writing" is a requirement.

Cancellations of a pull will be accepted with no penalty as long as there is ample time to report the cancellation in the newsletter with the same deadlines as for sanctioning a pull. If these deadlines are not met, the organizer shall (at their own expense) send out postcards to all members to notify them of the cancellation. If this is not one, an organizer will be subject to loss of sanctioning fees. (06/17) There will be no provisions for "Rain Dates". I have read and understand the above rules regarding sanctioning.

Autumn is on the way, 8 Hazards to Dogs

1. Nighttime walks

Ok, so nighttime walks happen year-round. But with the transition to shorter days, sunset might come sooner than you think. And you might not be prepared when darkness falls halfway through your walk. That's why it's a good idea to have some kind of reflective gear on you and your dog, especially if you walk him in an area with cars zooming by.

2. Mushrooms

The cool rainy weather and composting leaf piles make the perfect environment for mushrooms to start popping up everywhere, and, just like you probably wouldn't Not all mushrooms are lethal, but you never know which type of mushroom can be toxic. And you don't want to risk it. So keep a close watch when going for hikes in woodsy areas and other places mushrooms thrive.

3. Fleas and ticks

If you think fleas and ticks are a thing of the past once temperatures start going down, think again. You and your pup may pick them up on camping trips or walks through trees or tall grass, and nobody has time for itching or disgusting ticks that can transmit Lyme Disease and a host of other nasties that can come when dealing with these pests.

4. Mothballs

You can try to cling onto summer for as long as you can get away with wearing your booty shorts and flip flops, but the cold weather eventually wins. And that's when the cozy sweaters come out!

For those of you lucky enough to not be plagued by moth larvae that munch on your sweaters: everyone is jealous of you.

For the rest of us, we might still be using mothballs.

Keep your dogs away from these balls. If your dog just so happens to come up to you with mothball breath, get him to a vet ASAP.

5. Compost

If your dogs like to help out in the garden, make sure you keep them away from the steaming pile of gardener's gold in your yard. You don't want to deal with the poop squirts that might result from eating half-decomposed food. Also, any apple cores you chuck in there from making your delicious apple cider may make your dog sick.

6. Antifreeze

It's toxic. Just five tablespoons can kill a medium-sized pup. But your dog doesn't know that. And even if you take your car to the mechanic for all your car maintenance needs or dispose of your antifreeze properly, your neighbor might not. Don't let your pup drink from puddles, especially if you can't figure out the source.

7. Rodenticide

Creatures that can't stand the dropping temperatures will try to shack up in your house, which is why fall is a time people set out traps and poison. Regardless of where you stand on the 'To Kill or Not To Kill' debate, you can't ever be completely sure that your dog won't get his nose into something harmful.

Always keep your pup on a leash during walks to avoid ingestion of poison. And it wouldn't be a bad idea to have some emergency numbers saved onto your phone as well. **ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center Phone Number: (888) 426-4435**

8. Allergies. Specifically Hayfever.

Allergies can act up with the season changing from summer to fall, which could irritate your pup's skin. Make sure you consult with your vet if your dog shows signs of allergies.

As always, we recommend that you keep emergency numbers handy in case of any emergency. Don't hesitate to contact your vet or the **ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center Phone Number: (888) 426-4435** if you see your dog acting strangely or suspect he might have gotten into something he shouldn't have. After all, you can't ever be too cautious when it comes to keeping your family in good health.
